

Today, India looks to be on course to on course to join the league of developed nations. It is beginning to establish a reputation not just as the technology nerve-centre and back-officer to the world, but also as its production centre. India's secularism and democracy serve as a role model to other developing countries. There is a great pride in an Indian that easily integrates with a global economy, yet maintains a unique cultural identity.

But what is breathtaking is India's youth. For, despite being an ancient civilization that traces itself to the very dawn of human habitation, India is among the youngest countries in the world. More than half the country is under 25 years of age and more than a third is under 15 years of age.
